ANIMAL WASTE STORAGE FACILITY PLAN CHEKLIST

Each application for a permit is required to include an animal waste storage facility plan. The plan **may** include:

A plan or plans showing the facility location and site information. The plan shall be drawn to scale, with a scale no smaller than 1 inch = 100 feet.

- _____ Homes within 1,000 feet.
- _____ All buildings within 500 feet.
- _____ All roads within 500 feet.
- _____ Navigable waters within 500 feet.
- _____ Wells within 300 feet
- _____ The North arrow
- _____ Scale of the drawing and map legend.
- _____ Temporary benchmark and its elevation.
- _____ Legal description of the proposed facility.
- _____ The number and kind of animals for which storage is provided
- _____ Total livestock animals units. (All ages.)
- _____ The type of manure to be stored (solid, semisolid, or liquid).
- _____ The number of days of storage.
- _____ Soil test pit locations and elevations of test pits.
- _____ The elevation of groundwater or bedrock if encountered in the soil profile and the date of any such determinations.
- _____ The details and plans for the method and structures used in transferring animal waste into and from the facility.
- _____ Provisions for adequate drainage and control of runoff to prevent pollution of surface water and groundwater.
- _____ Type of fencing to be used.
- _____ A time schedule for construction of the facility.
- _____ A nutrient management plan written by a Certified Crop Advisor.

You may also wish to contact:

- A Certified Soil Tester and Master Plumber if you will be installing a sewer system

- Neighboring farmers who already have manure storage
- A local manure pump dealer to see what type of pump(s) will work best for you

You will also need written approval and a permit from Green County Zoning 328-9423.
